Toyohari is a complete system of Japanese Meridian Therapy steeped deeply in the Chinese medical Classics.

Toyohari techniques involve the use of gold, silver and steel needles, direct moxibustion, polarity devices, cupping and microbleeding as well as special tools based on the nine classical needles

The Toyohari Association was founded by blind acupuncturist Kodo Fukushima in 1959. Today worldwide more than 2000 practitioners, both blind and sighted, practice the Toyohari style, which continues to evolve and develop. This Foundation Course is approved by the Toyohari Medical Association, Japan. It teaches Toyohari style meridian therapy over twenty days in five four-day sessions.

Within the course, unique group practice methods help to rapidly increase the

practitioners ability to feel and influence Qi, enabling to diagnose and treat even difficult cases. The practitioner will learn six position comparative pulse diagnosis and the use of effective feedback methods such as abdominal, meridian and pulse palpation.

The traditional style of teaching and learning encourages deep exploration of what it means to be an acupuncturist and how to balance Qi, Blood, Yin and Yang using the Five Phase system.

The study and practice of Toyohari will refine the practitioner and engender confidence. It offers the opportunity to be part of an association that provides ongoing mentorship and training fostering continuous improvement.

The Toyohari foundation course is open to all registered acupuncturists and final year students of acupuncture/ Chinese medicine.
